Accountability Statement

The Annual Education Results Report for Lakeland Christian Schools for the 2022/2023 was prepared under the direction of the Board of directors in accordance with the responsibilities under the Education Act and the Fiscal Planning and Transparency Act. The Board is committed to using the results in this report, to the best of its abilities, to improve outcomes for students and to ensure that all students in the school authority can acquire the knowledge, skills and attitudes they need to be successful and contributing members of society.

This Annual Education Results Report for 2022/2023 was approved by the Board on Nov. 27, 2023.

Student Success

The educational philosophy of Lakeland Christian Schools depends upon the Bible to provide the viewpoint for interpreting any subject or any school activity. The mandate for Christian education comes from God's command that children are to be taught to love God and give Him pre-eminence in their lives, and that parents are responsible for the total education of their children (Deuteronomy 6). The teacher represents the parents during the school day but does not relieve parents of their educational responsibilities to their children.

Student success requires age appropriate development in several areas including knowledge, skills, godly character, healthy relationships, emotional resilience, and social responsibility. Achievement is influenced by many factors and does not always result in measurable outcomes. Local assurance of student growth and success is achieved by reporting those items that are measurable and communicating the programs and supports that are reasonably expected to achieve growth in domains that are less conducive to quantitative measure

About Us

Lakeland Christian Schools offer a small student/teacher ratio with programming from Pre-Kindergarten to Grade 12 that uses multi-media rich, individualized learning program that is well suited to meet the needs of our students. We provide individual programs for students that have a wide range of abilities, from the gifted to those with learning challenges. Our program emphasizes discipline, individual responsibility, parental involvement, and Biblical truth.

We maintain an ongoing process of continuous improvement which ensures our curriculum continues to meet the Department of Alberta Education requirements and outcomes for each course. Parents and other volunteers from the community enhance our students' learning experience as they share their experience in the school.


Lakeland Christian schools started an extension campus, Peace Christian Academy in Grimshaw in 2021-2022. In September, 2021, we started with 12 students, in June of 2023, we finished the year with 33 students. This is a new school and with that we have experienced some "growing pains". This attests to the varied results in the overall percentages for Lakeland Christian School Society versus the historical results in Lakeland Christian Academy. As Peace Christian Academy matures, we expect the differences to diminish.

Lakeland Christian Schools offer a home education program and a blended education program in partnership with parents who choose to home educate their children. We support parents in their use of the curriculum materials of their choice that best suit their children's learning needs.

- We discuss ethical and moral issues in a biblical perspective in each class as an important part of learning to be active citizens.
- We emphasize a strong work ethic, and care and respect for everyone in the classroom as well as in work experience
 programs, Registered Apprenticeship Programs, and community service. Students are expected to do their best and
 meet deadlines. The culture of our schools is positive and supportive due to the infusion of biblical values into all areas
 of our curriculum and activities.
- Students learn about the history of First Nations, Inuit, and Metis within Canada and demonstrate respect for all people and cultures as they are all created in the image of God. Lakeland Christian School Society has always promoted the study and appreciation of other cultures, including unique backgrounds of students. Our students have often taken part in mission trips to second and third world nations. The learning aligns with our belief that all people are created in the image of God and culture, art, social structures, reflect how we have been created.
- Everything we do is done within the context of our faith, therefore we are able to equip our students to be engaged and ethical citizens.



- Our school is a school of choice for parents. Parents are actively involved in the operation of the school and at school events as volunteers further enhancing student program quality.
- Student measure is quite low overall for student engagement. However, when the students were asked how they interpreted the survey question from Alberta Ed, the responded that they answered whether or not they "liked" the curriculum content often comparing it to their favourite subjects. When asked the question whether or not the instruction they receive is interesting and effective to help them learn the material presented, the students' responses were extremely positive.
- One of the highlights and successes in our schools is Regional Student Convention. This is a yearly competition in which students can compete in over 140 different events in the categories of academics, athletics, music, oratory, art, and numerous aspects of service. All of our students find areas that interests them and they are incorporated in our daily studies. Students learn about dedication, patience, commitment and striving for excellence as they prepare and compete in these events. Our students ages 8-12 compete provincially against over 100 other students and students ages 13-18 compete interprovincially against students from British Columbia to Northern Ontario. We have always done very well at these competitions bringing home many 1^{st,} 2^{nd,} and 3rd place prizes. Lakeland Christian Academy has won best in platform and music events many times.
